paid, shall be paid and discharged, and no longer ;-which, being seconded and put, paffed in the affirmative ; and thereupon,

The faid claufes were engroffed, and thrice read by the Clerk; and, upon the question feverally put thereupon, agreed to by the House, and made part of the faid Bill accordingly.

Refolved. That the Bill do pass, and that the Title be, An A& for granting to His Majefty an additional Revenue to defray the expense of the War: and to appoint Commissioners to borrow Money for the Use of the Province.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Council, and defire their concurrence to the fame.

Mr. Ritchie, pursuant to leave given, presented a Bill to empower the Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, to appoint Commissioners to Islue Treasury Notes, and the same was read a first time.

On motion, Resolved, That the Bill be now read a fecond time, and the fame was read a fecond time accordingly.

On motion, Refolved, That the Bill be now committed to a Committee of the whole Houfe : and thereupon,

The Houfe refolved itfelf into a Committee of the whole Houfe, on the confideration of the faid Bill accordingly.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Pyke took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee that they had gone through the Bill to them referred, and that the Committee had directed him to report the faid Bill, without any amendment, and he afterwards delivered the Bill in at the Clerk's Table.

Ordered, That the Bill be engrofied.

Mr. Crane reported from the Committee appointed to wait on his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with the Addrefs of this Houfe, in answer to his Excellency's Meffage of the 7th inftant, respecting Criminal Offences, that the Committee had, purfuant to order, waited upon, and delivered to his Excellency, the faid Addrefs accordingly.

An engroffed Bill to empower the Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, to appoint Commissioners to issue Treasury Notes, was read a third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pais, and that the title be, An Act to empower the Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, to appoint Commiffioners to iffue Treasury Notes.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Council, and defire their concurrence to the fame.

A Meffage from the Council, by Mr. Cogfwell :

Mr. Speaker,

The Council request a conference by Committee on the subject of the Bill, entitled, An Act for granting to His Majefty an additional Revenue, to defray the Expense of the War, &c. itanan katala sala sarata kali jarawara.

And then the Meffenger withdrew.
