appropriating such part of the Supplies, granted in this Session of the General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province.

His Excellency was then pleased to make the following Speech:

Mr. President, and Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council, Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

Since I had the honor of addressing you at the opening of this Session, a Treaty of Peace and Amity has been concluded between Great-Britain and the United States of America, the ratification of which has afforded repose, from the miseries of War, to the whole Christian World.

This happy event will I doubt not call into action the diligence and enterprise of the industrious inhabitants of Nova-Scotia: and as there is every reason to believe, that His Majesty's Government will extend its softering care to the Commercial Interest of this rising Colony, I anticipate, with the most fanguine expectations, the prosperity to which the Province is likely to attain from the commendable exertions of her industrious and loyal population.

I thank you very cordially for the liberal arrangement you have made in aid of the various fervices which this flourishing and improving Province now requires from its Legislature; and I am happy to embrace the opportunity, which your diligence and attention has afforded me, to release you from the labours of the present Sessions, and to permit your immediate return to your respective homes.

Afterwards the President of His Majesty's Council, by His Excellency's Command, said,

GENTLEMEN,

It is His Excellency's Will and Pleasure that this General Assembly be prorogued to Thursday, the Twenty-second Day of June next, to be then here held; and this General Assembly is accordingly prorogued to Thursday, the Twenty-second day of June next.
