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## TUNNEL UNDER THE CHANNEL

Long Deferred Enterprise Likely to be Consummated.

France Is Taking Necessary Steps to Negotiate With England.

New York, Aug. 30.—The 36th annual championship tournament of the United States National Lawn Tennis Association which started Monday has brought together the leading racquet wielders of the country. The favored Pacific Coast, the South and Middle West will match speed and skill against the best of Eastern stars and the leaders appear to be so evenly matched that there is no outstanding favorite for the singles championship now held by William M. Johnston, of San Francisco.

Chief interest will likely centre in the efforts of Maurice E. McLaughlin, the greatest tennis player ever developed in this country, to capture outright the mammoth silver bowl, emblematic of the singles championship. This trophy, the eighth offered since the formation of the Tennis Association in 1881, has been in competition since 1911 and must be won three times, but not necessarily in succession, in order to become the personal property of the victor. The present standing of the players who have won legs on the bowl is as follows: Maurice E. McLaughlin, San Francisco, two wins; J. H. Williman, Philadelphia, one; William M. Johnston, San Francisco, one; W. A. Larned, New York, one.

## BELGIUM'S QUEEN SETS AN EXAMPLE

Of Self-Sacrificing Devotion to the Victims of the War.

"I am not a queen at present. I am a fellow sufferer and helper." No words ever uttered could express more forcibly the attitude of the entire Belgian populace than this pronouncement of Elizabeth, Queen of the Belgians. This noble woman—noble in lineage and children behind and like her husband, is doing her share towards the succor of her country.

When King Albert said to his prime minister, "If necessary, you, my dear minister, and I will take our rifles and go into the battle, Queen Elizabeth, who was present, added, "And I, and with me all the Belgian women."

Queen Elizabeth did not literally shoulder a rifle, but she has made her way among Belgium's suffering population ever since the outbreak of the war, and has rendered invaluable assistance in the work of relieving those suffering the pangs of hunger and privation inflicted on them by the Germans. While Queen Elizabeth has not entered that part of Belgium where suffering is most acute, that district being under German government, her work elsewhere has been an example to the millions of women in the countries of the allies.

Canadian women are urged to look upon her and ask themselves if they have helped as they should. Belgium is still suffering and still continues in want until her rehabilitation after the war, and Canada and the other allied nations must give the support to her people that will keep up the moral strength—that great asset that held back the German hordes while Britain perished.

Hardly a Canadian woman but who could save \$2.00 out of the money she spends carelessly during a month. That \$2.50 would keep a Belgian mother and her helpless babes from starving for a whole month, provided the money is sent to your local committee or the Central Belgian Relief Committee, 59 St. Peter street, Montreal. Isn't it worth while?

### DISCOVERED SKULL

London, Aug. 30.—Charles Dawson, discoverer of the famous Pit-down skull, has died at Lewes, aged 52. He was for 22 years a local magistrate court clerk.

Dawson, who had been a student of archaeology nearly all his life, found the skull in a gravel pit near Lewes. It is that of a prehistoric woman, and it is supposed by scientists to be the "missing link." The skull was said to be the most important fragment of human remains ever discovered.
