NO MORE SUNDAY CARS.

Premier Whitney Makes Announce-ment of Government's Policy. Toronto, March 7.—In a letter ad-dressed to Mr. Lucas, chairman of

the private bills committee, Fremier Whitney yesterday ruled, on behalf of the Government, against allowing any more Sunday car privileges in Ontario. The announcement was in connection with the application of Port Arthur to be allowed to operate such a service. The letter read:

"The Government spent a great deal of time last year in preparing the Ontario Railway Act of 1906." The provision relating to Sunday traffic received a great deal of attention. There can be no doubt that the act, as finally passed, represents the feeling of a large majority of the people of this province.

"It is possible that in some respects, and from some points of view, it may impose hardship upon certain localities. Under the "circumstances, however, having in view the care bestowed upon the preparation of the act and our conviction that it represents the views of the people of the province, the Government feels that it would be taking a distinct even. act and our conviction that it represents the views of the people of the province, the Government feels that it would be taking a distinct step backwards to allow, within twelve months of the passage of the act, a new exception to be made which would open the door to a large number of similar applications in the future, and thus practically destroy the effect of the act as finally passed."


