Fruit Growers' Association.

The annual meeting of the Nova Scotia Fruit Growers' Association, adjourned from February, opened in Witter's hall, on the 26th ult., at 2 p.m. The report of the secretary reviewed the work of the association in the past year and showed the finances in a highly satisfactory condition. The president, Dr Henry Chipman, in his opening address, congratulated the membership on again meeting in an annual session with officers and members all spared to answer the roll-call; referred to the fact that the officers had spared no pains to make the annual meeting popular and successful in the highest sense of the term; spoke of the good work done in the past in exhibiting our fruit in the horticultural shows in Great Britain and the great World's Expositions in London, Paris and Vienna; the almost unlimited market for our apples in Great Britain; the fact that while in 1888 Canada sent to the English market 875,000 bbls. the United States exported 1,648,000 bbls. to the same market, and proved that the Mackinac Bill had, as regards our apples, done us but little injury; that we must in future, as in the past, seek a market in Great Britain for the bulk of our fruit; noted the fact that the rate of freight from this valley is much higher than it should be, in that point of fact it is much higher than it is from many other localities on this continent, while it should be, in that point of fact it is much higher than it is from many other localities on this continent, while it should be, in that point of fact it is much higher than it is from many other localities on this continent...

U. R. Replies to N. P.

EDITOR OF THE ACADIAN.—A correspondent signing himself "N. P." in your issue of the 20th inst. indulges in a good deal of "hifalutin" and misrepresentation, calculated, and doubtless intended, to deceive the unwary. Perhaps you will accept the apology for a reply, I purpose dealing with the misrepresentations only. I have no time for hifalutin. The statement of the Government's majority, "N. P." claims a majority of four in Quebec and Ontario. Surely he must know that the Conservative press concedes a majority in Quebec for the Liberals and only claims half the seats in Ontario. Taking the most favorable view for the Government, there is undoubtedly to day an average majority of ten in those provinces. So far as the other provinces are concerned his statement is probably accurate enough. In this connection it is well to remember that the Government went to the country with a majority of fifty strong, which, at the best, is reduced one half. "Unrestricted Reciprocity was killed on 5th March." When we reflect that the two most populous provinces of the Dominion, Ontario and Quebec, having a representation of 157 in a House of 215 members, have converted a Government majority of about 30 into a minority of 10, at least, it would seem as if Unrestricted Reciprocity, if dead, must be a very lively corpse indeed. Moreover, nearly one-half the votes at the recent election were cast in favor of that policy and it would seem now to be about time to drop the "Wynne-Farrar" epithets. They are not arguments—simply a very unworthy exhibition of spleen; and those who make use of them know well enough that the Liberal party is as loyal as any party in Canada. "The people have decided the trade policy of Canada for the next 25 years." How can any one who pays the slightest heed to what is going on around him thus express himself? Does he not know that the Government is pledged to Limited Reciprocity and that this pledge is all that saved it March 5th? Limited Reciprocity, if it means anything, is Reciprocity in natural products. What then would become of those important planks of the National Policy, the flour and wheat, corn and meal, fruit and nursery stock and coal taxes? So far from settling for 25 years the trade policy, on the lines of the N. P., the half an eye can see, completely knocked the bottom out of the policy of restriction. The whole country has voted for a change and the difference between the respective parties are ballots, of one degree only. "Which is right, Dr Borden or Edwain Blake?" (Dr B. said) "the Government was corrupt and the opposition was ever keen. The N. P. was legalized robbery." Let me quote from the Blake's letter—the passages for all Tory ilk just now—to find an answer to the above question. "The Canadian Conservative policy has failed to accomplish the predictions of its propagators. Its real tendency has been, as yet, twelve years ago, towards disintegration and 'annexation' instead of consolidation and the maintenance of that British connection of which they claim to be the special guardians. It has left us 'with a small population, a scanty immigration and a North-west empty still, with enormous additions to our public debt and yearly charges; an extravagant system of expenditure, and an unjust and oppressive tariff; with restrictive markets for our needs, whether to buy or sell, and all the hosts of evils (greatly intensified by our special conditions) 'arising, with trade diverted from its natural into forest, and therefore less profitable channels, and with unfriendly relations and frowning tariffs, walls ever more estranging us from the 'mighty English-speaking nation to which our neighbors and relations 'with whom we ought to be, as it were, promised that we should be, living in generous unity and liberal intercourse. 'Worse, far worse; it has left us with 'lowering standards of public virtue and a death like apathy in public opinion, 'with racial, religious and provincial animosities rather inflamed than soothed, 'with a subservient parliament and autocratic executive, debauched and dissipated and corrupted and corrupting 'class, with lessened self reliance and increased dependence on the public chest 'and on legislative aids, and possessed 'withal by a boastful jingo spirit, far 'enough removed from true manliness, 'loudly proclaiming unreal conditions and exaggerated sentiments, while actual facts and genuine opinions are suppressed. It has left us with our hands 'tied.' Thus writes Blake, in substantiation and not in contradiction of Dr Borden's criticisms of the Dominion Government. "6th. But 'it would have been better 'for his country if a member had been 'elected who would vote with the 'Government on other measures as well' (as Reciprocity). Again—'When Nova Scotia stands so well in the favor of the 'Government of the day it seems a pity 'that Kings County is again left out in 'the cold.' What lofty ideas are these! Why did our forefathers struggle after responsible government? Surely that great achievement were in vain if Kings County and Canada were composed of men (I) of the mental and moral calibre of Mr N. P. He would forthwith, reduce to mere machines for recording or approval of the 'Government of the day.'—Tory, always understood. This is going back to first principles with a vengeance. Perhaps he could induce Sir John Thompson to have a law passed by which the election in Kings shall be postponed until such time as it is certain to be known the Government (Tory) has been sustained. But then this might not work any better in Kings than it has worked in Huntingdon, whence comes the news, while I write this, of the overwhelming defeat of the government candidate. Think of it, N. P., and divide your sympathy, so disinterestedly bestowed upon the people of Kings with the even more benighted citizens of the county of Huntingdon! Shades of How! Can it be that any considerable number of people, enjoying the privileges of free government can sympathize with the base, unmanly and sordid idea of government patronage and pay shall be the leading consideration in deciding an election! It cannot be. "6th. As to the Liberal majority in this county from which N. P., owing to the reduction, as compared with that of 1887, affects to take much comfort. Let him whistle to keep his courage up. He should know that the majority of 1887 was altogether abnormal owing to the unpopularity of the Conservative candidate. He should know that parties are very evenly divided and that ordinarily a majority exceeding 150 is a large one in this county. He says that in Ward 9 the majority was out down from 32 to 16," but he should know that from 23 to 16—a reduction of 7. He continues, "In Wolfville Bill had a majority of 25, but he does not point out that Woodworth's majority in Wolfville in 1887 was 28—three more than Bill's. He then proceeds to show that 'Horton and Aylesford combined gave Bill a majority of six,' and that 'Cornwallis has the honor of electing Dr Borden, &c.' Horton gave Mr Bill a majority of 25. Aylesford gave Dr Borden a majority of 15, and Cornwallis gave him 167, and he therefore had a majority in two out of three townships, and not in one township only, as the misleading statement of N. P. would infer. On the same principle that he combines Horton and Aylesford to give Bill a majority of six, why not combine Horton, Aylesford and Cornwallis with a majority of 161 for Borden? "7th. 'Where will the subsidy come from for the extension?' (C. V. R.) 'Sir Richard Cartwright says money spent in Nova Scotia for Railways is thrown into ratholes. Sir John shouldn't spend any more to the rats.' This is a specimen trick of Toryism. No subsidy can come into a county which opposes the Dominion Government. Well, the Government has not been so bad as N. P. would have it. A subsidy to a railway and other public grants have been made to Kings by the Dominion Government during the past four years although represented by a Liberal. But has the Local Government no share in subsidizing railways? The statement attributed to Sir R. Cartwright is a deliberate invention and cannot be proved. As to the rats—who are they? Presumably the members of the Cornwallis Valley Railway Company, which includes in its stock list men of the highest financial standing, some of whom happen to be Conservative as well, for instance, George Woodworth and two Burgesses. It will certainly not hurt these gentlemen to be characterized by N. P., nor is it likely to do the latter very much good. "8th. 'The grand old man's' praises are sung. 'He built the Canadian Pacific Railway' and paid for it, I suppose, out of his own pocket! 'He has made money cheap in the London money market.' Poor Mr Gaschen the British Chancellor of the Exchequer gets no credit whatever! Well, I suppose Mr Gaschen will survive. But what seems to cap the very climax of obsequy is the statement regarding Sir John that he is the man 'who is above all other men pre-eminently qualified to negotiate a treaty with the U. S. 'government in the interests of the Country.' The man who has stated deliberately on the floors of Parliament his conviction that he cannot get a renewal of the old treaty of 1854, and who now states that he will negotiate upon no other lines is a nice man to secure a treaty. The man who holds up to scorn and derision the whole American nation as Sir John did at Halifax last fall is indeed laying the foundation for successful reciprocity negotiations! Better try again, N. P. Give us a little spice in the way of some Pacific Scandal reminiscences; or tell us again that story of how the 'grand old man' on a certain occasion, after having sent a sum of money to Bied to get him out of the country held up his hands and piously exclaimed before an Ontario audience, 'Would to God I could catch him!' These things are more in the 'grand old man's' line than negotiating reciprocity treaties with United States. U. R. March 24, 1891. Fruit Shippers' Association. Fruit Growers, having adopted the principles of the following prospectus to enable fruit growers to deliver their apples in England at about half the price now extorted from them and in more suitable vessels, have appointed the following gentlemen a committee to canvass the project and report at a meeting of fruit growers to be held in Berwick at 1 o'clock on 20th April, 1891, when if such an Association is considered desirable 400 shares of stock will be then issued. Committee: John Churchill, W. H. Blanchard, Dr Chipman, J. W. Bigelow, Leander Rand, Stephen Sheffield, Barclay Webster, M. P. P., A. P. Welton, M. P. P., Dr P. Borden, M. P., Caleb Bill, T. H. Parker, Wm. Chase, R. M. Rand, John Starr, B. Starrat, Miles F. Chipman, Wm. Miller, Wm. Chipman. The Nova Scotia Fruit Shippers' Association is to consist of the holders of not less than 400 or more than 600 shares, who on payment of five dollars for each share shall apply for an act of incorporation under the limited liability act, empowering them to purchase or charter vessels or engage freights for the fruit trade from Nova Scotia, and in any and every means to advance the interest of the fruit growers of Nova Scotia. Each shareholder to be entitled to ship in any vessel chartered by the association not more or less than fifteen barrels of apples for each share held and paid for by him at the current rate of charter, and failing to do so, he is to forfeit his share and to have no further action by said association, the secretary's report that he has failed to fulfill his contract being a cancellation of his share. That no member can hold more than twenty or less than one share. That said shares are not transferable except by act of the directors or the death or removal of the shareholder. That any shareholder may buy, borrow or form a club with any other fruit growers to make up his proportion of said shipment. That any vessel chartered by said association is not allowed to carry apples for any other shareholder unless from any cause they do not complete their cargo; then the party at the rate of not less than ten cents per bbl. extra freight. That the number of shares and cost of shares may be increased by a majority vote of the board of directors at any time when necessary. That at an annual meeting on the first Monday in May said association shall appoint a board of six directors, one in Kings and three in Cornwallis and one in Hants—who shall serve free of charge except payment of travelling expenses. And said board shall appoint a secretary or managers who, under their supervision, shall transact all the business of said association in every detail, and receive in payment not more than two cents per barrel all apples shipped by said association, to be collected with the freight.
