DERMOTT'S BELL

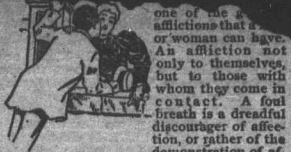
When the meeting was over Lord Edward Fitzgerald came up to Martin and took him by the arm.
