### MILLERTON NEWS

A New Pulp Mill Spoken of-Dis. satisfaction over Delay in Missing Link.

It is rumored that another pulp rill is to be established in Millerton to mannfacture pulp with sul-hite. It is understood that it will be in connection with the Miller Tanning Extract Company. Something like two tank cars of acid are used weekly in the manufacture of the extract and the freight on the two cars is about \$50 a week. It would be a considerable saving to the Company if they had their own acid.

As showing the benefit the Beveridge Pulp Concern has been to Derby it may be mentioned that were \$5,000 worth of pulpwood has been contracted for in this season, a great part of which has been delivered by rail on the Can-ada Eastern. When the Missing Link is in operation, it will make a very large saving in the amount paid for freight. The company has been very much inconvenienced by the delay in operating this line. There seems to be no valid reason why trains should not be running through to Blackville long before this. It is hoped that there will be a "shaking of the dry bones" when the new I.R C. Commissioners ret to work. There is no reason why it should not have been in overation all winter. 


