Homestead Regulations.

Any even numbered section of ion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepthomesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres more or less.

Application for entry must be ade in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub agency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by 1 roxy. may, however, be made at an Agen cy on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intendiu omesteader.
