Portia Arrived.

The s.s. Portia, Capt. T. Fitzpatrick, arrived here from the westward at 1.35 p.m. to-day. The trip west, beginning on the 12th inst., was on the whole stormy, especially when the ship had to wait till the recent heavy S. E. storm was over. The Portia arrived at Bonne Bay last Friday at 3 a.m., and leaving for home at 8 a.m. had a fairly good run till yesterday, when the storm of north wind was encountered, making progress slow. Capt. Fitzpatrick reports having plentiful at Bonne Bay. There were two vessels there loading up, one being J. Bonia's schooner, the Smuggler, who loaded in two days. There were ten vessels in Bay of Islands last Saturday, all doing well, as far as they could learn, with the herring. They were all up in the North Arm and were not spoken to. Herring struck in at the lumber Arm for the first time this season last Friday. The Portia brought in steerage 50 fishermen of St. Mary's and Placentia Bays who came to settle up their affairs for the season. The fish is being brought along in schooners. House of Lords And Self-Reform.

London, Nov. 16.—Pending Premier Asquith's official statement before Parliament on Friday small hope is entertained of clearing up the involved situation which has resulted from the sudden change caused by Lord Lansdowne's call for the Veto Bill.

The feature which stands out in the present position of the parties is that the House of Lords finally has awakened to the absolute necessity of undertaking self-reform. The Radical leaders, in connection with this late repentance look upon it with the utmost suspicion, and it remains to be seen whether it will emanate into an agreement which the abortive veto conference failed to achieve.

Burial at Sea to Be Abolished.

London, November 12.—It is proposed to abolish burial at sea in the case of liner passengers. Shipping companies regard the proposal as quite practicable, and if it is adopted by one or more of them the others are certain to fall in line. "Deaths of passengers at sea are rare nowadays," said an official of the Allan Line yesterday, "we have not had one this year on any of our ships.
