Reports Diana Practically Clean. The S.S. Erik, Capt. D. Martin, ar The S.S. Erik, Capt. D. Martin, arrived from the Gulf sealfishery at 7 o'clock this morning, hailing for 300 seals. mostly old ones. Shortly after leaving here on March 8th, the ship struck the land near Bay Bulls Head, being carried in there by the ice. Twelve men, who were on deck, jumped ashore and came back to St. John's. The ship was only slightly damaged and proceeded to Channel, which was left on March 12th. Going up the Gulf very heavy ice was met and the ship got jammed and made very little headway for the entire season. Only a few scattered seals season.
