WEEKLY MEETING.

The weekly meeting of the Council was held yesterday afternoon. Deputy Mayor Martin presided and Councillors Outerbridge, Vismonte, Gollier, Ryan and Dowden were present.

After confirmation of minutes of the last meeting of the Council, the business was disposed of as follows:

The residents of Cornwall Avenue, West, at junction of Hamilton Avenue, called attention to the necessity of having water and sewerage extended to that locality. They stated that if the Council were unable to extend both mains, at least, they should place water there. The matter was deferred for further consideration at the finance meeting.

The residents of Plank Road forwarded a petition, requesting that the name of this road be changed to "Deanery Avenue." The request was acceded to.

The Nfld. Motor Association wrote in reference to poles near the site of the fire hall, Southside Road, and also at St. Clair's Home, LeMarchant Road, which were considered dangerous to traffic. The Engineer was instructed to report on same for next meeting.

Superintendent Morris of the Electrical Department, Reid Nfld. Co., stated the matter of Water Street pavement, near car rails, would be attended to in short.

C. F. Bennett & Co., asked that Roger's Cove be attended to and that the surface be coated with oil (Tarrifa). The Council is unable at the present time to accede to this request.

Communication of Jos. Bennett, re the condition of Sullivan Street, and the necessity of placing a light there, was referred to the Lighting Committee who will give the same consideration.

Messrs. A. Scapellato and W. H. Willis applied for installation of water and sewerage to their houses, Sandbury Street. The Plumbing Inspector is to obtain further information in this matter.

Mr. J. Cullen, McKay Street, complained of damage done his property through overflow of watercourse. The Engineer is to see what can be done to remedy the grievance.

The following matters were referred to the City Engineer: Application of C. A. Bourne for permission to install electric motor on premises, Water Street; application of A. Ryan for permission to lay concrete sidewalk in front of his dwelling, Queen Street, and of T. Rice for permission to repair building, Cabot Street.

The following plans were passed: E. Barry (dwelling) Southside; R. J. Crumney, (outhouse) Hamilton St.; E. Saunders, (outhouse) Pennywell Road; J. Heel, (outhouse) Quidi Vidi Road; E. G. Harsent, (garage) Robinson's Hill—provided he installs ventilator; American Boot & Shoe Store, Water Street, (alterations); English American Clothing Co., (repairs and addition) 314 Water Street.

The following plans were deferred: E. Bowering, Watford Bridge Road, and J. M. Dock, Cockpit Road. These localities are not connected with water and sewerage, and the Council intend holding a special meeting to give this important matter consideration. The securing of sufficient funds to carry on the work of extending water and sewer mains, will also be considered. Of late many building applications had to be refused, owing to that section of the Act, which prohibits the granting of permits for erection in localities where water and sewerage are not available.

J. Clarke, Cabot Street, must forward plan of proposed addition to his dwelling, before his application can be considered.

A discussion took place re the dredging of Public Cove, and it was pointed out that while all the coves are under the control of the Council, they are not in any way responsible for his work, and as the owners of adjacent wharves receive the benefit of such dredging, it is only reasonable that they at least should bear the expenses in this connection.

Attention was called to the condition of Kenna's and Robinson's Hill, and the Road Inspector is to be instructed to have repairs made.

During the past week, the Council had a number of men employed in building a wharf, floating stage, etc., at the Swimming Pool, Long Pond. The concrete dam at the mouth of the river was removed by blasting, and the approaches to the pool thus rendered possible. An expert swimmer, Mr. Lawrence Hickey, has been engaged as instructor, and all necessary precautions have been taken. It was reported that one day during the past week, the impounder, while running some stray cattle to the pond was assaulted by a number of people on the Southside Road, who drove the animals away from him. The case of these parties who interfered with the impounder in the discharge of his duties were ordered to be detained, and legal proceedings will be taken.

The Inspectors were instructed to compile a list of owners of dogs within the city, with a view to having those who have not complied with the regulations dealt with. The reports of the City Engineer, Health Officer, Sanitary Supervisor, etc., for the week, were read. Accounts submitted were ordered to be paid, after which the meeting adjourned.

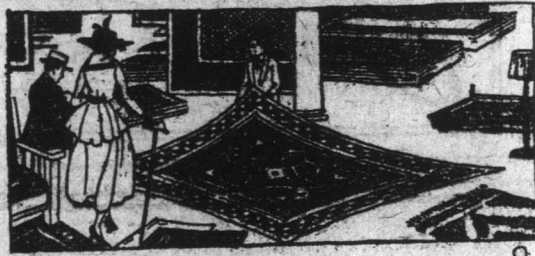
