### Certain Provisions of the Municipal Charter

Daitor Evening Telegram. Dear Sir .- I think you would be conferring a favour on the citizens of St. John's if you would publish the following Sections of the St. John's Municipal Act 1921, They all have reference to Sanitation, Housing and Finance

Yours truly. JAMES MURDOCH. Nov. 9, 1925.

Sec. 78.—The Council shall have power to lay water mains and sewerage pipes through any existing street the city, and shall assess against all building sites on the said street or adjacent thereto, which may be benefited, such proportion of the cost of the said water and sewerage pipes as total length of the frontages on the said streets.




