In Last Loan Drive This Province Raised Nearly Half of the Last Loan, Averaging \$79.03 each.

Ontario's large place in the economic position of Canada was never better illustrated than in the last Victory Loan campaign.

As a result of the splendid campaign and the generous response of the people, the Province of Ontario raised \$204,185,400 of the \$419,389,000 for the Dominion in the Fourth Loan.

This came from 363,000 subscribers, averaging \$79.03 each, out of the \$80,035 lenders in all Canada, averaging \$53.13 each.

Quebec came second with \$94,287,250 from 126,534 subscribers of \$41.66 each.
