#### WILL CHICAGO PASS LONDON?

An American Scientist's Estimate-The

Big Cities of the Future. Springfield, Mass., Sept. 9.—At Saturday's meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science Mr. Corthell read a paper on "Growth of Great Cities." He said that London is destined to be the greatest city in the world, at least in our lives, unless Chicago, with its phenomenal in-crease, might catch up in about four decades. He disputed Gen. Booth's statement that the Whitechapel district is the most densely populated district in the world. Sanitary district A of the tenth ward of New York, he said, was the most densely populated district in the world, not even excepting the densly crowded parts of the city of Prague

FUTURE BIG CITIES. Referring to his chart, Mr. Corthell said that, as shown by the figures, which represented researches and statistics gathered as far back as 1700, Chicago, with its phenomenal growth, is likely to distance many other cities in the world now much larger. Its density of population, however, is small on account of the large area it takes in. Situated as it is, it may be expected to continue to grow rapidly for the next three decades. Mr. Corthell closed by predicting the popula-tion of some of the world's greatest cities in 1820, as based on past and present growth, and allowing for a future decrease. His predictions are: Population of London, 8,344,000; Paris, 3,808,586; New York, 6,337,500; Berlin, 3,422,221; Chicago, 7,796,600; Philadelphia, 1,838,160; St. Petersburg, 1,470,833.






