On this day when on the road early n the morning he met a powerfu chief called Ahheolabow. emanded Brooke's rifle. Brooke said nat he needed the rifle, and could either give it to him nor sell it.

chief threatened that he would take by force, and struck Brooke three imes with his sword. Brooke did viped the blood from his face and rereated with the coolies. 


