The U. S. President To Get Law After "Panama" Scandai" Folk.

Washington, Dec. 11. - "If they car be reached for criminal libel I shall try to have them reached," said President Roosevelt in speaking yesterday afternoon about those Americans who have been guilty of infamous faisehood concerning the acquisition of the prop erty and construction of the Panama Canal itself.

It was to the committee of 100 of the Lakes to the Gulf Deep Waterway Association, headed by Governor Deneen, of Illinois, who were received by the President at the White House, that he nade this declaration.

Governor Deneen had presented copy of the resolutions adopted by the association, and made a few remarks, to which the President replied in part "I have felt that no more important service can be rendered to this country than the building of the Panama Canal, and I am proud that there has not been legitimate cause for the breath of scandal connected with any feature of the proceedings. We have cause to be ashamed of a certain set of Americans in connection with the canal, and that is of those Americans wrongly condemned and illegally diswho have been guilty of infamous missed.
