EGG PRICES ARE LITTLE HIGHER

Wholesale Dealers Compelled To Pay More Money on Local Market.

BUTTER AGAIN SCARCE

Seems To Be No Adequate Supply in This District - The Quotations Today.

It was a quiet market this morning and features were lacking. Only six loads of hay were brought in. Most of it sold around \$12 a ton, while inferior loads sold a little lower. Three loads of straw went off for \$6 to \$6.50 a ton.

Wholesale dealers are paying a little higher for eggs, 1910 a dozen being the figure paid by the crate, while it is expected they will go up to 20c a doz. Eggs are plentiful, but the price is being kept up by the big dealers, who are paying 20c a dozen.

Butter is not coming in in very large quantities, and the price remains unchanged. Butcher's meats still maintain a high figure. Very little dressed pork was brought in today, and the price is \$11.50 a cwt. a cwt.

The butchers are still complaining of the scarcity of beef, and say they are unable to get prime supply to meet the demand. \$9 to \$11 a cwt. is still the figure being paid.
