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**SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE PUBLIC HEALTH**

COURSES OF WESTERN

Presented by Victorian Order

of Nurses.

EACH WORTH \$400

Will Cover Expenses for an

Eight-Month Course.

Scholarships for graduate nurses, to

enable them to take the public health

courses of Western University, are

announced as available from the Victorian

Order of Nurses of Canada.

The Victorian Order had discontinued

its own public health course and accepts

the Western University course as given

by the Institute of Public Health in its

place. Western University is thus on a

par with other universities of Canada

in having its course accepted, and these

scholarships made available to its

students.

Each scholarship is worth \$400, and

is intended to cover fee, board and

lodging, etc., during the eight-month

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**SEWER CONNECTIONS FOR LONDON TP. TAXPAYERS IN HURON ST.**

Will Pay 30 Cents Foot Front-

age While Citizens' Cost

Is 45 Cents.

For residents of London Township to

have sewer connections to their homes

at two-thirds the cost to local taxpay-

ers may seem strange, but this will

become an actual fact if an agreement

pending between the city and the town-

ship is closed. The sewer in

between Richmond and St. George

streets, where residents of the south

side are in the city, while their neigh-

bors across the road reside in London

Township.

The sewer was authorized to be laid

for the convenience of the property

owners residing on this street within the

city limits. However, the township

taxpayers across the road have com-

menced and requested that they be

allowed to have access to this sewer.

As it will not require any larger cal-

iber than the sewer now in use, the

township has agreed to have it con-

nected to their houses, and that they

pay 30 cents per foot frontage, while

citizens of London pay 45 cents

per foot.

It seems rather strange that town-

ship owners should have city sewer

connections one-third cheaper than local

citizens, explained City Clerk S. E. Grif-

fin. "However, the cost of the sewer

connections is not the only factor. The

council could refuse them the use

of the sewer, but then the city would

be deprived of 30 cents per foot front-

age on the north side of the street,

which would be a loss to the city.

It is really giving the town-

ship residents a sewer that costs them

nothing extra to do so, and collect 30

cents per foot frontage from them for

it. It is best in the long run."

Officials at the city hall stated today

that the sewer is now being laid, and

that the township owners are agree-

able to the scheme, and that an agreement between

the city and township will be signed in

the near future. This sewer which is

being constructed from Sherwood ave-

nue, will run under the street, and

thence to the Victoria street sanitary

sewer, which has been authorized by the

council, and is estimated to cost \$20,000.

It is five and a half city blocks in length, and is practically

completed excepting for the trenching

work, which has been held up pending

an agreement with London Township.

This sewer will be laid deeper than

the one now in use, and will serve

the houses on both sides of the street.

It is owing to the fact that other

areas will drain in it when com-

pleted.
