



JAY GOULD'S FUNERAL. It will Take Place To-Day to Woodlawn New York, Dec. 5.—That simplicity which characterized Jay Gould's life was observed at his funeral services this afternoon at his late home, 579 Fifth avenue. house. The total estimates are \$421,612,215, being \$12,-003,522 more than the estimates and \$1,-649,755 less than the appropriations for the present fiscal year. Included in the above statement are the figures relating to every branch of the Government. The estimates for pensions are \$156,831,350, being \$19,766,800 more than the estimates and \$12,086,482 more than the appropri-
