To purchase, take on lease and otherwise acquire any real and personal property in the Dominion of Canada or elsewhere, and any concessions, licences, rights or privileges which the company may think necessary, and to develop the resources of the same and to turn to account the lands, buildings and rights for the time being of the company in such a manner as the company may think fit, and in particular by clearing
