The Expected Appointment of Mgr. Tas-cherean-His Claims to the Henor. From the Montreal Star.

A well informed collesiastical corres pondent writes: "It is very probable that Mgr. Taschereau will shortly be named cardinal. There is more talk of it now

cardinal. There is more talk of it now than ever. It would certainly be a well-merited honor, for since his elevation to the archieptscopal throne of Queboc he has succeeded by his prudence and discretion in firmly re-establishing harmony among the catholics.

"His first act of authority as archbishop, the condemnation of the famous R. C. program, made known at once what sort of a man the church of Canada had to govern it. That act seemed severe to some of his auffragans, but they ended by understanding the meaning of this condemnation. For the rest, the results obtained in all the live questions which have been agitated since he has held the reins of power show in what esteem he is held in Rome,

"At present that address to bee XIII. appropos of the encyclical "Immortale Dei" which all the catholics of Canada are hastening to sign at the request of Mgr. Taschereau, will cause to be seen at Rome more than ever the influence of this man in the church of Canada, and it will be a new and additional title to his elevation to the college of cardinals."
