Governor Letellier Dismissed. In the Quebec Assembly Friday afternoon the Premier read the following despatch, handed him by Lieut. Governor Letellier:—

Quebec, 25th July, 1879. To the Hon. Lieut. Governor de St. Jean, Spencer Wood, Quebec: Sir,—I am commanded by His Excellency the Governor General to inform you that, by order of His Excellency in Council, passed this date, you are removed from the office of Lieut. Governor of the Province of Quebec, and that the cause assigned for such removal, in conformity with the provisions of the 59th section of the British North American Act of 1871, is that after the vote of the House of Commons of the last session, and that of the Senate during the preceding session relative to your conduct as Lieut. Governor, your usefulness as such has expired.
