Much might be done by the children of our church, for missionary purposes; and as I know that you are anxious to promote a missionary spirit, I venture to direct the attention of your readers to the contributions of the Beaverton Sabbath School. It may help to stir up others to do something in the same way. A missionary box is there laid on the table each Sabbath. It is opened twice a year, and the contents are disposed of as the majority of the Scholars decide. On Thursday 12th Instant a meeting was held for this purpose. The contents of the box together with gifts handed in at the meeting, amounted to within a little of \$11. The \$11 were completed by a friend; and the scholars decided that the sum thus realized, should be sent to the Free Church of Scotland, to bespeak in aiding missionary work among the Turks. There were a number of the parents and others present. Two short addresses were delivered bearing on missionary enterprise. When we dispersed, all seemed pleased that our Juvenile offering was so handsome, notwithstanding the monetary depression. The box was formerly emptied about the beginning of January last.
