Acts of Apostles, in Greek Testament, and Zenophon's Memorabilia, Book 1st.

III. A Gaelic Bursary of 25, open to students of the Theological classes, for the best Essay on "The Duty of Prayer and the Encouragements to the performance of this duty."

IV. A Gardie Bureary of £5, open to students of the Preparatory classes, for the best appearance at an oral examination.
