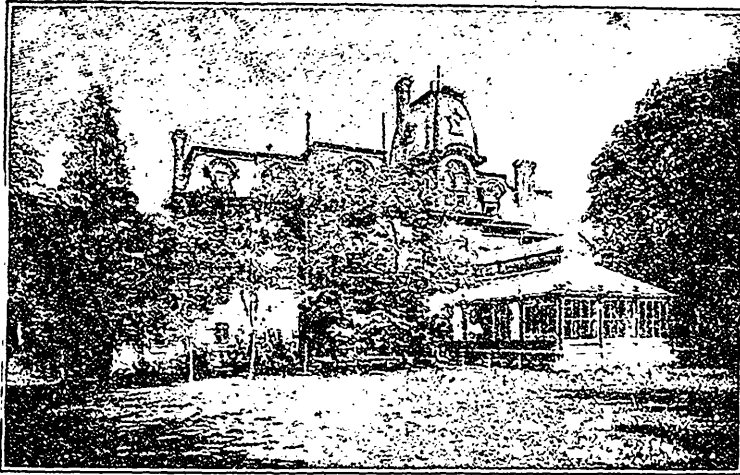


BRANKSOME HALL

THE AIM

of the founders of the School will be to impart to the girls entrusted to their care thorough training in all the departments of study usually undertaken in the Public and High Schools of the Province, supplemented by careful instruction in Music and Art. It is also hoped that the atmosphere of the School will be that of a happy Christian home where everything will tend to promote true character-building.

THE EQUIPMENT

of the School, both on its Academic and Domestic side, will be adequate and complete. Nothing will be left undone to secure the health and comfort of the pupils. The spacious lawns and other facilities will afford ample opportunity for exercise and recreation.

THE SITUATION

of the school buildings at some distance from the street, within large and well-wooded lawns and adjacent to the beautiful Rosedale ravine, is acknowledged to be one of the most eligible in Toronto. Situated on the Belt Line and not more than a minute's walk from the Church Street line of the Street Railway, it is easily accessible from all parts of the city and from the Union Station.

As only a limited number of resident pupils can be accommodated, an early application is desirable.
