Sunday School Books. The Bampton Lectures. The subject of the volume for 1861 in this series is "The Progress of Doctrine in the New Testament," by the Rev. T. D. Bernard, M.A., of Exeter College, Oxford.

Sebastopol in 1854-5. The Substance of the Russian account of the Defence of Sebastopol, from the pen of General Todleben, has been given us by Dr. Russell of the 'Times,' in the shape of a Review. Dr. Russell does not attempt to criticise the work, or reconcile the various statements with those of the English and French account by Kinglake and De Bazancourt.

The Globe Edition of Shakespeare. This marvel of publishing enterprise has met with universal favour. The first edition of 20,000 was at once bought up, and this, too, so recently after the extensive sales of the Tercentenary editions. But we are not surprised at this, for the 'Globe Edition' is a most tempting and desirable one; it is edited from the best texts, by the editors of the new Cambridge Shakespeare, printed in elegant and readable type, very portable in size, handsome in binding, and at a price that will place it within the reach of all.

NOTES. In the year 1864 there were published in London 3563 works and new editions, including pamphlets; of these there were of Religious, 715; Biography and History, 232; Geography, Topography and Travel, 151; Fiction or Juvenile Works, 642; Poetry and general Literature, 505; Annuals and new serials, 166; Law and Parliamentary, 79; Medical and Surgical, 124; European and Classical Philology, including translations, 132; English Philology and Education, 177; Naval, Military and Engineering, 52; Politics and Questions of the Day, 56; Agriculture, Horticulture and Field

Sports, 46; Art, Architecture, &c., 52; Commercial, 41; Science and Natural History, 122. It is curious to note the extent of sale reached by the more important works of the day at Mr. Murray's annual trade dinner, last month. Lord Derby's Translation of Homer reached 990; Dean Stanley's 2nd series Jewish Lectures, 3,200; Grote's Plato and Companions of Socrates, 750; Robinson's Geography of the Holy Land, 500; Vambory's Central Asia, 1,600; Smiles' Life of Brindley, 4,200; Smiles' George and Robert Stevenson, 2,900; Lyell's Elements of Geology, 1,500; Smith's Dictionary of the Bible, 3 vols., 1,200; Millman's Latin Christianity, 9 vols., 400; Smith's Student's Manuals, 10,500; Byron's Works, 1 vol., 1,100; Markham's Histories, 10,000; Smith's Latin Dictionaries, 4,300; Do. Classical Dictionaries, 3,000; Smiles' Self Help, 1,200; Stanley's Sinai, 600; Stanley's Jewish Church, 700; Hallam's Historical Works, 1,000; Blunt's Coincidences, 600.
