approach to this area of studies, the University recently has introduced Spanish. There are no students preparing for an M.A. in West Indian studies at present.

At the undergraduate level, a fourth-year seminar in West Indies studies is offered. The social, political and economic conditions in the British Caribbean are examined. The undergraduate programme does not, however, allow for concentration in the area.

Military studies

A secondary specialty of Acadia is military studies. This subject is offered within the Department of History and is available as an area of concentration for an M.A. Library resources have been built up over a good many years. The University would supervise an M.A. programme concentrating on contemporary strategic studies.

Centres, institutes, interdisciplinary committees

Canada-Commonwealth Caribbean Centre

Director: Professor D. G. L. Fraser

Establishment of the Centre was announced in October 1968. The Centre will co-ordinate interest and activity in West Indian affairs and will provide a facility for studying the area and matters of mutual interest to Canada and the Commonwealth Caribbean. The announcement also stated that the Centre would provide a clearing-house for West Indian information to interested Canadians.
