

Exchange of Notes (June 7 and 10, 1933), extending for one year the reciprocal "blanket" permission of September 15-16, 1932, for flights of military aircraft, between Canada and the United States of America.

Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your note No. 59 of June 5, 1933, stating that there is no objection on the part of Canada to the renewal until June 30, 1934, of the agreement* concluded by our two Governments last September through an exchange of notes whereby blanket permission was granted for military aircraft of either Government to fly over specified portions of the territory of the other for a period of one year, beginning July 1, 1932.

As stated in the Legation's note No. 12 of May 27, 1933, I am authorized to extend the agreement referred to on behalf of the United States Government until June 30, 1934. I should, therefore, appreciate being informed whether the Canadian Government agrees to the extension of this agreement for the period specified and receiving your assurance that this note will be accepted by the Canadian Government as sufficient confirmation thereof by the Government of the United States.

I avail myself of the occasion to renew to you, Sir, the assurances of my highest consideration.
