- Stokes B. ed. Open for Business: Creating a Trans-Atlantic Market Place. New York, Council on Foreign Relations, 1996. Contains eight articles by leading economists and trade experts charting a course for future trans-atlantic economic cooperation. Critiques consider the publication to be a road map for trans-atlantic economic relations in the 21st century.
- Stone F.W. <u>Canada, the GATT and the International Trade System</u>. Montreal: Institute for Research on Public Policy, 1990. It examines, from a Canadian perspective, the origins, structure and operations of GATT and other international agreements and institutions of the multilateral trade system. Examines some major developments and issues of special interest to Canada that have emerged within the system.

Winters L. Alan ed. <u>Trade Flows and Trade Policy After 1992</u>. New York: Cambridge University Press, 1992. The volume offers an appraisal of the effect of completing the EC's single market program on trade among EU member states and also on the Union members' external trade.

Eastern and Central Europe & Former Soviet Union:

Bosworth B.P. & Ofer G. Reforming Planned Economies in an Integrating World Economy. Washington: Brookings Institute 1994. The authors provide a balanced assessment of the progress made by the formerly centrally planned economies in economic reforms, including trade liberalization. The focus is on China, the states of the former Soviet Union and the nations of Eastern Europe.

International Monetary Fund. "Trade Policy Reform in the Countries of the Former Soviet Union". <u>IMF Economic Reviews</u> 2, 1994. It is a compendium of international and internal trade measures in the former Soviet Union, 1990-93. A comparison with Eastern Europe is made.

Lang F.P. "Strategic Trade Policy for Eastern Europe". <u>Intereconomics</u>, 27, pp. 182-89, July/August 1992. Advocates utilizing human capital by entering the market as suppliers of standardized cheap industrial products.

OECD Centre for Cooperation with the Economies in Transition, <u>Trade Policy and the Transition Process</u>. OECD, 1996. Covers the development of trade regimes in line with international trading rules, the impact of Uruguay Round on transition economies, trade barriers affecting exports, and regional economic cooperation initiatives in the states of Eastern Europe and those of the former Soviet Union.
