THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS ANNOUNCED THAT A CONVENTION EETWEEN CANADA AND INDIA CONCERNING THE PRIORITY OF PATENTS OF INVENTION WAS CONCLUDED IN OTTAWA TODAY.

THE HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR INCIA, HIS EXCELLENCY DR. M.A. RAUF, SIGNED ON EEHALF OF THE GOVERNMENT OF INDIA AND THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS, MR. L.B. PEARSON, SIGNED ON EEHALF OF THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT.

THE CONVENTION PROVIDES GENERALLY THAT CANADA AND INDIA WILL EXTEND RECIPROCALLY THE PROVISIONS OF EACH COUNTRY'S LEGISLATION WITH REGARD TO THE PROTECTION OF PATENTS TO CITIZENS OF THE OTHER CONTRACTING PARTY AND TO EODIES INCORPORATED OR REGISTERED UNDER ITS APPROPRIATE LEGISLATION. THUS THE EENEFITS OF THE CANADIAN PATENT ACT SHALL BE ENJOYED BY INDIAN CITIZENS AND INCORPORATED EODIES AND LIKEWISE THE BENEFITS OF THE INDIAN PATENTS AND DESIGNS ACT BY CANADIAN CITIZENS AND INCORPORATED BODIES.

THE CONVENTION SHALL COME INTO FORCE THREE MONTHS AFTER SIGNATURE, AT WHICH TIME THE APPROPRIATE NOTIFICATIONS CONCERNING THESE ARRANGEMENTS SHALL HAVE EEEN PUBLISHED RESPECTIVELY IN THE CANADA GAZETTE AND THE GAZETTE OF INDIA.
