## UNITED STATES TO BUILD LIBBY DAM

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Hon. Paul Martin, today announced that the United States Government has exercised the option given it by the Columbia River Treaty to build the Libby Dam on the Kootenai River in the United States.

In a Note delivered at Ottawa, United States

Ambassador W. Walton Butterworth notified the Government of

Canada of his Government's intention to commence construc
tion on the project by June 30 of this year. The terms of

the Treaty require that the dam be in full operation within

seven years of the date specified for commencement of con
struction.

While the Libby Dam will be located on the Kootenai River in Montana, the reservoir formed by the dam will extend 42 miles into Canada, flooding some 13,700 acres of land in the East Kootenay Valley of British Columbia.

Under the terms of the Treaty which was ratified on September 16, 1964, the Government of Canada will provide the necessary reservoir area in Canada. This responsibility, including any costs involved, has in turn been accepted by the Government of British Columbia through the Canada-British
