DISABLED PERSONS ACT-B.C. PROTESTS

1, 2, and 3. There is no record of any correspondence having been received from the minister of health and welfare or any other member or official of the government of British Columbia, containing any com-

regulations passed under the Disabled Persons Act. There is no record of any letter having been received from minister of health and welfare containing any reference whatsoever to the said regulations, either before or after they had been approved.

The minister of health and welfare for British Columbia attended a conference of provincial ministers and officials, called by the federal government in January, 1954, to discuss the main outlines of the proposed federal disability allowances legislation.
