in this regard. It is not a matter of debate at all unless the government wishes to make it so.

Mr. Nasserden: I have a supplementary question for the Acting Prime Minister relating to medicare. Have dominion-provincial relations deteriorated to the extent that the federal government now has no clear indication from the provinces of the extent to which medicare will be implemented in July next?

Mr. Speaker: I suggest to the hon. member that this question, as asked, is highly argumentative.
