#### MR. NIELSEN-ALLOTTED DAYS, S.O. 62-PROPOSED MOTION

Hon. Erik Nielsen (Yukon): Madam Speaker, I rise on a point of order. There seems to be some doubt with respect to whether or not we in the Opposition, as of right, have the privilege of filing notice of an allotted day subject after six o'clock. It is clearly after six o'clock now and if the House would feel so disposed to grant its consent to extend time for filing under Standing Order 47, we would want to move the following motion for tomorrow's allotted day which has been designated by the Government House Leader:

That this House condemns the Government for its contempt for the taxpayers of Canada, which it demonstrates by the creation of a taxation system in the form of the Income Tax Act that is increasingly incomprehensible for individual taxpayers and by its failure to end capricious and unfair practices of the Department of National Revenue.

Madam Speaker: I do not think I will hear much argument. I will ask whether there is unanimous consent. Is there unanimous consent?
