#### THE SENATE

Hon. Herb Gray (Leader of the Opposition): Mr. Speaker, in the absence of the Prime Minister, I have a question for the Deputy Prime Minister.

It is about something that pertains directly to the executive authority of the Prime Minister. Under section 34 of the Constitution, the Prime Minister in effect appoints the Speaker of the Senate.

Yesterday, in what has been called "the worst example of parliamentary dictatorship", the Speaker of the Senate broke the rules of that place in an attempt to force through the GST.

I ask the Deputy Prime Minister: Why has the Prime Minister allowed the Speaker of the Senate, his appoin-
