
ORDERLY TO CHIEF OF POLICE DEAD

John James Clarke Died in Denying the Son of God Putting Darkness For Light

EDUCATED IN GERMANY BILLY SUNDAY CHALLENGED—DOES HE DENY THAT JESUS IS THE SON OF GOD?

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH

V.EST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a ramily, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Yanitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also fifty acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent nizy be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased right may take a present patent right may take a present patent.
