mails, &c. The correspondence of the department is also conducted in French whenever necessary.

2. The postage stamps, in the opinion of the Postmaster General, bear all the information required by the public to prevent any possible mistake. The stamp itself with the figure thereon indicating the value

is sufficient for all purposes.

The size of the postage stamp, especially the space available for lettering, is very limited. Besides, the present inscription on postage stamps is so familiar, and therefore so easily understood by all elements of the Canadian population, that it would be unnecessary to make the suggested change.

To engrave and print a new series in order to admit of a dual inscription might, in addition to the extra expense, involve a radical change in the existing contract. Therefore no change is contemplated in the system which has been in force during the

last 50 years.

3. The post office stamps that bear the name of the office, the date of the arrival or of the sending off of letters, &c., are, for all practical purposes, printed in both languages. The name of the post office can not vary, the date is expressed in numerals. As regards the name of the month, the abbreviation standing for them are almost identical. No change is contemplated.

THE FRENCH LANGUAGE.

Mr. ARMAND LAVERGNE-by Mr. Talbot-asked:

1. Has the Minister of Railways taken any steps to have the rights of the French language better respected on the government railways?

2. Will time tables in French be distributed

on the Intercolonial?

3. What steps have been taken for the use of the French language on the Intercolonial Railway, in accordance with the requirements of business and of the people?

Hon. W. S. FIELDING (Minister of Finance). Instructions have been given for the printing of time tables in the French language to be placed in all the Inter-colonial Railway stations in the province of Quebec. The question whether any further printing beyond what is now done is needed in order to meet the convenience of the people of that province is under consideration; and, if needed, additional French documents will be printed.
