HAMILTON MILITIAMEN WERE INJURED IN CAMP

One Had Several Ribs Broken in Boxing Match and Another Was Struck.

HAMILTON, June 16.—(Special.)—George Richards, 19 Margaret-street, a local militiaman, was brought from Niagara Camp this morning and taken to the city hospital suffering from the effects of several broken ribs, which it is understood he received in a boxing match. J. E. Orgar, another soldier, was also brought and taken to his home, 309 North Wellington-street. He had been struck at camp.

CHEQUES WERE BOGUS

A. E. Allen, alleged bogus cheque artist, is being sought by the local police. The cheques are pronounced forgeries by the Canadian Bank of Commerce at Toronto, on which institution they were drawn.
