London, Jan. 27.—(Associated Press)—Except that the returns from the constituencies have not been received, the general elections in the United Kingdom are ended.

Liberal Unionists are supporting the Liberal Unionist party. The Labour Party will become the great democratic party of England. The fact that Labor felt its strength in this election is bound to give impetus to the movement in the future, especially as John Burns, Labor Party leader, has been prominently seated in the cabinet. Mr. Burns is generally conceded, in certain respects, to be the most able and energetic of the party's supporters, notwithstanding the virulent attacks made upon him by the adherents of the aristocratic and the jealousy of a certain element among the Liberalists.

Some twenty-five members of the Labor party belong to what is known as "Labor representatives." They are pledged to discontinue their votes of either side, and to vote in accord with the wishes of their constituents. So long as they receive instructions they are paid \$1000 each year by the Labor representatives' committee. The other Labor members who are pledged will probably stand with the Liberal side thru thick and thin, and on Labor questions will vote with the majority of some twenty or thirty of the more radical Liberalists.

The new parliament opens a wide vista for speculation on the possibility of combination. The minority is homogeneous, the majority heterogeneous, and the concrete minority is certain to endeavor to secure the support of sections of the majority.

It is a fact that Joseph Chamberlain has been outlining a plan for the Unionist support of Labor on the union proposals. Mr. Chamberlain in a speech that he made in the House of Commons on the 27th inst. stated that he had written to Mr. Balfour and Mr. Chamberlain in the future will work hand in hand for tariff reform on the Chamberlain lines.

It may be pointed out that the tariff reform movement has not been without its victories. The Chamberlainites are drawing much consolation from the fact that the causes Unionist free traders were defeated by members of the Chamberlain group. Mr. Chamberlain and the Unionists will take a leading part in the coming session of parliament, and it is not unlikely that the tariff reform movement will develop during the first session.

The Nationalists who expected to hold the balance of power are somewhat disappointed. Political prophets do not hesitate to predict that the Nationalist party will be reduced to a mere party of protest, and that the Liberal Unionist party will be reduced to a mere party of protest.
