

Annual Cost of Maintenance, \$76.000 -Provincial Board of Health Selects Septic Tank System.

SEWAGE SCHEME ADOPTED

IT IS TO COST \$2.385.000

After many sessions of serious conleration the provincial board of ealth last night came to a decision to approve of a septic tank system for disposal of Toronto's sewage, which is one of the four plans submitted for consideration by City Engineer Rust and Medical Health Officer Dr. Sheard, The estimated cost of establishing the system is about \$2,385,000, and the annual cost is estimated at \$76,000. The board approves of the adoption of the plan or excellute the diverse. of the plan on condition that the city ovides for sufficient ma hat the soil is suitable.

The choice is known as plan No. 2 of the city engineer, and is as fol-

Construction of septic tanks in the icinity of Ashbridge's Bay, near the Woodbine, and the purchase of 500 or 00 acres of lands immediately north 600 acres of lands immediately north of Danforth-avenue, in the vicinity of Woodbine-avenue, to be used as filter beds, the sewage to be lifted to this point. The land proposed to be pur-chased is of a sandy gravely nature, and admirably suited for the purpose. Mr. Rust does not consider that any profit should be anticipated from the sale of the produce.
