KING EDWARD BETTER NOW ABLE TO LEAVE FOR HOME

His Majesty Completes "the Cure" at Marienbad and is Returning to London.

Marienbad, Bohemia, Sept. 7.—King Edward to-day completed the cure and left Marienbad for London.

Marienbad is situated in the portwine of Bohemia, that troublesome Slavonic portion of the Austrian empire, which is wedged between the territories of Francis Joseph and those of his ally, the Kaiser Wilhelm. The town lies to the south of Carlsbad, and the springs of the two places have much the same qualities, the difference being that at Marienbad the waters are cold, and at Carlsbad they are warm.

The curative effects of the Marienbad waters are said to be almost as catholic as those of an American patent medicine. Obesity, gout, anæmia, troubles of the heart, the liver, or the digestion—all are spirited away by their magic touch. But probably the bracing air of this little town among the pine hills, 3000 feet above the sea, and the regular life enjoined upon those "taking the cure" are equally beneficial with the waters themselves.


