Kansas Bank Gone Under.

Kansas City, Mo., Nov. 30.—The Missouri National Bank, the largest bank in Kansas City, has just closed its doors. The failure created a surprise, as the bank was under tood to be in a sound condition. Its last statement was made Oct. 6, and showed resources at the close of business that day to be \$1,785,357.24. Its capital was \$2.50,000. Examiner Forman says the condition of the bank is practically the same to-day as on Oct. 6. The only difference is the value of some of the assets. No trouble is anticipated at any of the other Kansas City banks.
