Will Establish Alaska Coaling Station
as Precondition for Trade.Washington, May 26.—Admiral
Dewey, as president of the Gen-
eral Board of the Navy, has recom-
mended the immediate
establishment of a coaling station at
Dutch Harbor, Alaska, and the erec-
tion there of a coal depot with an initial
capacity of 5000 tons. The estimated
cost of the work is about \$50,000. The
President has approved the plan and
preliminary steps in the work have been
taken already.Canada's Strategic Advantage.
Rear Admiral Bradford, in his report

tion, said: "Attention is also invited
to one of the great political questions of
the day, viz., the settlement of the
boundary between Canada and Alaska,
