LOCAL MARKET.
London, Thursday, Aug. 23.
Today's market was not as lively as Tuesday's. The attendance was large for this day of the week. The majority of the stuff offered consisted of the small products of the farm and garden. There was not much change in prices.

Hay and Straw.—The demand for hay continues to be brisk. Prices were higher than on the previous day. Sales were made at \$1.50 to \$1.75 per ton. Straw is scarce; there was none offered.

Butter and Eggs.—Butter was in good demand as there was hardly sufficient offered to supply the wants of the grocers and dealers. Prices are likely to continue firm for some time, and there is a possibility that they may go higher. Sales were made today at 21c to 22c for crocks and 23c for pound rolls. Eggs were in fair supply. Sales were made at 14c per dozen for crate and 15c for basket lots.

Vegetables and Roots.—Potatoes were more plentiful today. Sales were fair at 10c to 11c per bushel. Onions were not so numerous as on Tuesday, and sales were made at 8c to 9c per bushel. The new coming company are offering 30c per bushel, they are likely to make large purchases on the market. The gardeners say that tomatoes are at the lowest figure; cucumbers are dull at 12c per dozen; pickling cucumbers 10c per dozen; cauliflowers, \$1 per dozen; corn, 5c to 6c per dozen; peas, 10c to 12c per quart; bunch stuff sold at 20c per dozen.

Fruit.—Apples sold fairly well at 35c to 40c per bushel. Pears were scarce today, and sales were slow at 30c to 35c per bushel. Peaches were very plentiful, and sold at 25c to 30c per bushel. Plums, 10c to 15c per bushel; muskmelons, \$1 to \$1.50 per dozen.

Poultry.—Spring chickens sold at 45c to 50c per pair alive, or 85c to 90c dressed; ducks sold at 55c to 60c per pair alive, or 95c to 1.00 per pair dressed. Hens and geese to be dressed.

Dressed Hogs.—Sales were made at 79c per cwt. The market is too warm for business in this line.

Butcher's Meats.—There was not much demand in this line; prices were unchanged.
