## BRITISH DEFEAT GERMAN ATTACKS AFTER YIELDING UNDER PRESSURE

Enemy Launches Drive From Two Directions in Cambrai Zone.

BATTLING IS TERRIFIC

Boches Are Mown Down by Artillery and Machine Gun Fire.

POSITIONS ARE REGAINED

Foe Is Bringing Troops From Russian and Italian Fronts to the Fray.

LONDON, Nov. 30 .- Strong forces of Germans attacked the British on a wide front in the Cambrai sector this morning, but were repuised after heavy fighting, in which the attackers sustained great losses, according to the official statement issued tonight. To the southward, in the region of Gonnelieu, the enemy entered the British positions at several points, and penetrated their line for some distance, but later were driven back. The text of the communication follows:

"This morning, after a violent bombardment, the enemy attacked with strong forces on a wide front south of Cambrai, between Vendhulle and Crevecoeur-Burlescourt. Shortly afterward heavy attacks also developed against our positions west of Cambrai, in the our between of Bourley. Germans attacked the British on a wide our positions west of Cambrai, in the eighborhood of Bourlon Wood and

Moeuvres.

"From Masnieres to Moeuvres all the enemy attacks have been repulsed after many hours of fighting, during which great loss was inflicted on the attacking German infantry by our attacking German infantry by our artillery and machine gun fire.

"South of Masnieres village, from the neighborhood of Bonavistovillers-Glusheld and the enemy succeeded in entering laid, the enemy succeeded in entering laid, the enemy succeeded in entering our positions at different points, and genetrated as far as Lavacquerie and Gouzeaucourt. 

DULUTH, Nov. 30.—The United States food administration in arranging for an extension of lake service beyond today has obtained from the shipping board the use of a new ship just off the ways at Duluth to carry a cargo of 1,000 tons of flour from Duluth direct to New York, according to a telegram received late today.

The Great Lakes Transit Corporation and the Northwestern Steamship Company are the companies that have agreed to extend their service, the former until December 12 and the latter for as long as weather conditions will permit. This will permit the transportation of approximately 80,000 tons of flour and wheat from Duluth to Buffalo and Erie, according to the message.


