POLICE ON SATURDAY COOPED UP TWENTY-ONE

NEW YORK, Sept. 20.—The steamer Siberia, which arrived here yesterday from West Indian ports, ran into the recent hurricane off the Bahama Islands, the storm commencing Sept. 11 and continuing until the 14th. The barometer fell to 29.8.
