Falkenhayn Wounded

COMMAND GIVEN UP

Former Chief of General Staff

Reported Shot in Leg.

Rome, Oct. 20.—Field Marshal Falkenhayn, former chief of general staff of the German army, has been wounded in the leg and compelled to relinquish command in Transylvania, said a Zurich despatch to The Corriere d'Italia today.

General Erich von Falkenhayn was formerly military instructor to the Chinese Government, then governor of the Gobi in crown prince before the outbreak of the war. On Oct. 7, 1914, he was named chief of the general staff. He was displaced by Hindenburg as chief of staff and three days later took command of the Transylvanian operations against the Roumanians. He is 53 years of age.

CANADIAN MINES SOLD IRON ORE TO GERMANY

Bonar Law Admits Two Concerns Supplied Huns Before War.

Canadian Associated Press Cable. London, Oct. 19.—In the commons tonight Sir Henry Dalziel asked the secretary for the colonies what quantities of iron ore were exported by the Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Company to the Krupp and other German firms in the year prior to the war. He also asked whether contracts with the Krupp concerned contained any war clause extending the term of contract to a period equal to that of the war. Bonar Law referred the question to his answer of last January, when he was asked regarding the exact relationship between Canadian owners of hematite ores of Belle Isle and German munition makers. On that occasion he replied that the ores were owned by two Canadian companies, one of which before the war was melted, the whole of its ores in Nova Scotia. The other sold only a part of its production in Germany. In 1913-14 out of a total production of iron ore in Newfoundland of 1,200,000 tons, 45,000 were exported to Germany and 95,000 to Holland. He had no information regarding contractual relations between these Canadian and German firms.

ONLY TWO SAILORS

LOST WITH ALAUNIA

Further Assurances Given That All Passengers Were Previously Landed.

New York, Oct. 20.—The Cunard line announced here today word had been received that all but two of the crew of the 13,400-ton steamer Alaunia, which was sunk yesterday by a German submarine, had been rescued. The English Channel, had been rescued. As far as can trace, all crew save except two.

Another message received, the officials said, reiterated previous information that all passengers were landed Wednesday at Falmouth, so that which took place after the Alaunia had left Falmouth for London.

BIG U. S. EXPORTS.

September Record for Single Month.

Washington, Oct. 20.—Exports of the United States for September were \$512,847,957—a record for any single month. Exports for the year ending with September totaled \$5,511,000,000; imports dropped \$5,000,000, to \$1,614,128,642, during September.

Imports for the year ending with September totaled \$5,507,765,667. The net inward gold movement for September was \$85,712,789, and for the year \$456,032,244.

MAUSER WORKS ESCAPED.

Berlin Gives Version of Allies' Air Raid.

Berlin, via Saville by wireless, Oct. 20.—The Mauser Gun Works at Oberndorf-on-Neckar were unharmed in the raid by forty Anglo-French aeroplanes, it was officially announced today. Only fifteen enemy flyers reached Oberndorf, dropping six bombs. The others, dispersed by German flyers, dropped their bombs on villages in meadows and numerous little villages killing three persons and wounding nine. Nine enemy flyers were shot down and the names of their pilots and occupants given.
