Pre-war Pomp and Pageantry Mark Opening of Dominion Parliament

ANNOUNCED WILSON WILL PUT HIS VETO ON U.S. TARIFF BILL

Also Make Final Attack on Republican Congressional Policies.

VOTE POSSIBLE TODAY

Washington, Feb. 14.—Development centering around tariff legislation made its first steps today. They included the declaration by Minority Leader Underwood in the senate, that he had received assurances from President Wilson that he would veto the Fordney emergency tariff bill, not by a mere withholding of his signature, but with a comprehensive statement giving his reasons, coupled with a final attack on Republican congressional policies.

Mr. Underwood, as well as Senators Gray, Democrat, Louisiana, and Smoot, discussed the amendment and several other senators got into the debate.

COMMUNIST PLOT AIMED AT FRANCE

Documents Seized Show It Was Intended to Overthrow Others Also.

Paris, Feb. 14.—The overthrow of the bourgeois governments of Spain, Italy and France is outlined in documents seized after a three-day search today, following upon the discovery of a widespread Communist plot. The date fixed by the Communists for this event was May 1, 1921.

The contemplated arrest of two Communist members of the chamber of deputies, alleged proof against whom Judge Jussell has delivered a warrant for the interior, and the seizure of documents which seem to be a realization of the importance of the attempt against the security of the state.

Discoveries made by the police of Barcelona and Milan show that the plot included the three European Latin countries.

Soviets have been organized throughout France with Brest as headquarters, according to police, ready to take over the railroads, banks and transportation, and all civil government.

The discovery of documents emanating from Berlin and paid thru a United States transportation company appears to have caused a revision of feeling in French political and official circles, and also among the workingmen's committees, which, so long as the leaders professed to be working for principles were willing to support them.

The French Communist press, departing from its menacing attitude of the past few months, expresses surprise that repressive measures should come from Premier Briand, a former comrade.

L'Humanite, the official organ of the French Communists, appears to be especially upset by the arrest of the city editor, M. Danon, a cancelled cheque for twenty thousand francs issued in whose name at Berlin the police hold.

The consensus of opinion in the chamber lobbies, where the probable arrest of the two Communist deputies has been freely commented upon, is that the government has struck a knockout blow against the Communist propaganda, and that when the minister of the interior requests the lifting of the parliamentary immunity in the case of the two compromised deputies, his request will be granted by a large majority, and finally that the plot is doomed to failure.
