SHIP TO VANCOUVER BY MEXICO ROUTE

Montreal, Oct. 16.-A sailing which attracted more than ordinary interest Friday, was an original comedy drama in four acts. The simplicity of the play will make a strong appeal to all classes of theatregoers, being a delightfully blended combination of sentiment and comedy. The presenting company is said to be more than equal to all requirements, the personnel including the names of several well known stock players.

Later in the week some important programs, an original comedy drama in four acts, the Sokoto, Elder-Dempster steamer, which left yesterday morning for Havana and Mexican ports, carrying a large consignment of general merchandise for Vancouver and Victoria, B. C., via the Tehuantepec route. The present shipment exceeds by over 100 per cent. the former one of this nature. It was stated this morning that these shipments were an experiment on the part of eastern manufacturers desirous of overcoming the transcontinental freight charges. Where time was not a consideration in the transit, the plan would be workable, as the water charges, with marine insurance added, were less than the through freight rates by the Transcontinental rail route.

The cargo for Vancouver and Victoria consisted among other things of 20,000 cases of canned goods, 400 coils of rope, 1,000 boxes of starch, 50 coils of wire, 50 cases of honey, 100 packages of axes and saws and a large quantity of package freight.

The Mexican season for the Elder-Dempster line has been a favorable one, and the Sokoto's cargo is one of the best to date of the present season.

M. Cahill. In the open bogey handicap a veteran golfer-in fact one of the earliest players in this community-in the person of C. C. Bell of the Brae-Burn Country Club, led the field of 82 starters. Bell, with a handicap of 9, finished even.
