## GRAND SCRIBE'S REPORT.

The returns not having yet come in from all the Subordinate Divisions, the report of the G.S. on this subject is of course incomplete, and forms another cause for the increased exertion of Representatives, in remedying an evil, solely the result of inattention and thoughtlessness on the part of Subordinate Divisions.
